Secondly, to sort: Assuming all files are in the same folder as your original script, you can sort the list of filenames (the ones that start with and ending with.pdf in this case) by using the Python built-in sorted function. This function sorts in numerical order, so to sort numerically, add the numbers in the filenames together and then sort alphabetically. for filepath in sorted(os.listdir(full\_directory\_path)): print('Working on file'+ filepath) with open(full\_directory\_path + '/' + filepath, 'r') as pdf\_file: pdf = pdf\_file.read() This will output what is in your current output, but in the same order. If you want to sort them in some way other than alphabetically, you'll have to do a bit of custom coding. The sort methods are listed here.
